



1. Rhetoric conducted a debate competition on the topic '**Law on Abortion : A Matter of Right to Life or Freedom of Choice**' on 18th July, 2022. The competition started at 11:00AM in the Capitanio hall, with 14 participants. Rhetoric invited Rooman Ma'am (Department Of History) and Vineela Ma'am (Department Of Economics) as the judges for the competition. There were 3 rounds:

1. Elimination round: 2 minutes speaking time, 8 participants were picked for next round. The round concluded around 11:30 AM.

2. State your Stance: 5 mins were given as speaking time.

3. Rebuttal round: 2 minutes were given for each person who were divided into 2 teams according to their stance, participants contradicted each other in this round.




2. Students of the club participated in the Student Induction Program where they presented a skit on the values of the college on 22nd August, 2022. Students were able to put across the values of the college in a fun manner.




3. The social sciences departments of St.Francis College in collaboration with the Rhetoric and the Chanakya clubs, for Political science and Public Administration respectively, put together pictures, colours and paper onto a canvas to portray the horror of partition in a collage-making competition. Students from various disciplines gathered in groups of 3 to 4 and put together creative illustrations that exhibited the theme of the partition in 1947. 9 teams participated in the competition that was judged by Ms. Deepa James and Ms. Padmaja from the Department of Commerce.



4. Commemorating the 75th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Rhetoric organized movie screening, highlighting Human Rights issues. Rhetoric selected the screening of the movie 'Trees Of Peace'. The movie highlights the Rwandan Genocide that happened in 1994. When death comes knocking for four women in Rwanda, they seek refuge in each other.



5. The club also hosted an Extempore competition on the 12th of December, 2022. The competition was held over 3 rounds. In round 1 speakers got a common topic: "effect of caste politics on minority rights". In round 2 students choose a topic for a pool of topics and were given 10 minutes to prepare. In the final round students were given an image prompt and they again had 10 minutes to prepare for the same before they spoke in front of the judges. Dr. Rohit Kumar and Mrs. PVS Lakshmi served as the judges for the competition where 10 students participated with enthusiasm.





6. On 25th January 2023 the Rhetoric Club, under the department of Political Science of St. Francis College for Women conducted a competition named Design a Policy on the topic, "Electoral Reforms", marking the 13th National Voter's Day. It was an intra-college competition with 6 groups in total. Dr. Afshan Shireen, assistant professor, and Dr. Sinjini Bhattacharya, assistant professor of the Department of Political Science, judged the competition. There were six teams namely - The Reformers, The Diplomats, TAS, Rangers, Panchatatva, and Avalsroms. Each team was given 4 minutes to present their policy/ies and then the stage was open for judges to ask questions to them regarding the same. The teams were judged on the basis of their teamwork, presentation, relevance of their policies in making elections inclusive, accessible, and participative, and implementation of policy i.e. organization and application models used.



7. The students also run a very vibrant wall magazine which is regularly updated with issues related to contemporary politics and issues of relevance. Students are encouraged to submit original write ups for the same.
